Summer 2017 Preview

Each year spring comes around and many of us begin to anticipate summer. This is especially true at Camp. There is something special that takes place each summer here and as I write this, we are eighty days out from our first summer session. It is exciting to think of the kids and adults coming our way and how the Lord is preparing their hearts.

June 5-9 is Day Camp for children who have just finished Kindergarten through the 6th grade. Day Camp is the perfect fit for any child who may not be ready for an overnight camp just yet. Every day is packed with activities that include slip 'n' slide, canoeing, singing, fishing, Bible lessons, team competitions, and so much more.

June 14-18 is Junior-1 Week. For children who have just finished 2nd through the 6th grade. Junior Week is a great way to ease kids into

an overnight stay. Capture the flag, the Pirate Game, several crafts and swim time make it very exciting for this age group and keeps their attention all week long. Junior week provides very involved and understandable lessons from the Bible each day.

June 25-29 is Junior-2 (Formerly week. Jr. Livingstones week) designed for children who finished have just 2nd through the 6th grade. We'll have many Bible lessons and fun filled days of team competition. Our skills based classes reflect our teenage LivingStones week.

July 9-15 is Teen week and is for teens who have just finished 7th grade through high school graduates. Teen week is devoted to helping teenagers become followers of Jesus while enjoying lots of Raucous Fun Time and Comic Hilarity. The majority of these teens come from the River Valley area around Russellville but include Oklahoma. groups from Tennessee and Texas as well.

July 16-22 is LivingStones week, and is also for teens who have just finished 7th grade through high school graduates. This week utilizes team building activities, competitions, prayer walks, skills-based classes, and a guided tour through God's word. Teens from all around Arkansas. Oklahoma City and Tulsa make up this camp.

This will be our third year to host Camp Agape. We are privileged to join in the, "...mission to share God's love with children whose parents are in prison."
