He Makes All Things New

It appears that spring has finally arrived. Oh, we may still have the cool evening, the windy days, and wondering if it will every stop those weekly showers of rain. But spring is here, and the signs of it are all around us. The leaven of the trees is turning green and so is everything else as the pollen blows in the air. Yards are being mowed and flowers and gardens are being planted (finally). Just the other day I saw little goslings waddling about behind their momma. Everywhere are the signs of new life.

Near the end of the book of Revelation, we witness the fall of the dragon, the harlot city, and the beast. After all this we read these words; *Then He who sat on the throne said, "Behold, I make all things new."* (Rev. 21:5) These were words of assurance that all the horrors the saints were suffering was soon coming to an end and brighter days lay ahead. There is something special about what is new, isn't there? For example, consider how a new baby in the family brightens everyone's spirits, how that first new home or car brings a smile to your face, and how about the sound of a crisp new twenty-dollar bill.

The Bible speaks of new things, it speaks of a "new covenant", a "new commandment", and a "new way". It also speaks of a "new creation". In 2 Cor. 5:17 the apostle Paul writes; *Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new.* Those

who have chosen to follow Jesus, demonstrating their new faith by being born again of the water and the Spirit having their sins washed away, rise up to walk in newness of life. They are now that new creation Paul spoke of. Notice he says; "*old things have passed away*". That former life and all of its lustful desires of the flesh have passed away. Our thinking and our conduct have changed. We now seek the things that are above and live our lives accordingly, as we walk according to the Spirit and not according to the flesh. We now strive to be imitators of God in righteousness and holiness. The new life!

We look forward to that new body in the resurrection. The hope of the Christian is the resurrection, the assurance that the grave does not have the final say, that it is not the final victor. Being new in Christ goes beyond this life. Paul says that if we only hope in Christ in this life, we are to be pitied more than all men. Some have questioned the resurrection saying; "What will we look like in this new body?" To these individuals I would give the same answer that John gave to the brethren in the first century; "*Beloved, now we are children of God; and it has not yet been revealed what we shall be, but we know that when He is revealed, we shall be like Him, for we shall see Him as He is.*" (1 John 3:2) We will have that new body in the resurrection!

Then there is that promise of the new home, that place in the Father's heaven. We will dwell in the Father's house and sit at His table in perfect communion. We will dwell in that place where there is no need for the sun, for God is its light. In that place there are no more tears, no more pain or sorrow. What promises of the new home! We have the assurance that Christ Jesus is making all things new. Aren't you glad you are a part of that as a child of God? And, if you are not a child of God, don't you want to be a part of that? Just food for thought.
