"The Anointing Teaches You Truth"

I am writing these things to you about those who are trying to lead you astray. As for you, the anointing you received from [the Holy One] remains in you, and you do not need anyone to teach you. But as his anointing teaches you about all things and as that anointing is real, not counterfeit — just as it has taught you, remain in him. — [1 John 2:26-27 NIV](#)

We live in a world of competing voices, many of them deceptive. How do we filter these voices and know the truth about Jesus? We know the truth because the Holy Spirit, who is the anointing we have received, teaches us the truth about Jesus. The Spirit is the very presence of God that he poured into our hearts when we came to Jesus in faith and baptism ([Titus 3:5-6](#)). The Spirit teaches us to build a home in our hearts for the truth of Jesus. The practical questions that arise out of this anointing are pretty simple:

- How much time am I spending with Jesus?
- Am I spending time in the Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John) so I know the Lord's teachings and see the way that the Lord ministered?
- Am I intentional about doing what I do to honor the Lord?
- And am I inviting the Holy Spirit into my daily conversation to help me know the truth about Jesus as I seek to "remain in him"?

It's nice to be around someone that lets you share the conversation. Most of us have things we like to share. It is very frustrating to be around someone who tries to monopolize the whole conversation. We wish we could send them to some course on "How to listen attentively."

There is quite a bit in the Scriptures about the tongue and the problems it can cause. Talking too much and too fast can also be damaging.

"A time to tear, and a time to sew; a time to keep silence, and a time to speak." (Ecclesiastes 3:7) A wise person knows when to keep silent and when to speak.

"Wisdom is the reward you get for a lifetime of listening when you would have preferred to talk."

Remember the story of Jephthah? He was to fight the Ammonites for Israel. The Lord was with him. Before going to battle, he made a vow to the Lord that if he conquered the people of Ammon he would sacrifice, as an offering, the first thing that came out of the door of his house. After returning home from winning the battle, who should come running from his house, but his only child, his daughter. He was devastated, but he had made a vow and had to keep it.

"Do not be rash with your mouth, and let not your heart utter anything hastily before God. For God is in heaven, and you on earth; therefore, let your words be few. For a dream comes through much activity, and a fool's voice is known by his many words." (Ecclesiastes 5:2-3)

If we fall into the category of talking too much or too fast maybe we should work on this. We have to bridle our tongue every day to keep our foot out of our mouth. If we slow down from talking too much, it should keep us from getting choked on our foot!
