*And the disciples were filled with joy and with the Holy Spirit. — Acts 13:52 NIV*

Soup and sandwich. Love and marriage. Horse and carriage. These things go together according to a couple of old songs. But there are two things that go together far better than any of these. *"But Manasseh led Judah and the people of Jerusalem astray, so that they did more evil than the nations the Lord had destroyed before the Israelites." 2 Chron. 33:9* Manasseh, son of Hezekiah (who had done right in the Lord), became king of Judah when he was twelve. He did evil, more evil than the heathen nations. He ruled 55 years, longer than any other king in Judah and in Israel. Later in his life he humbled his heart, tried to influence the people of Judah, but had implanted too many foreign ideas into their hearts. They would not listen; he had led them astray for too many years.

Our sins do not just affect us. They affect those around us. Manasseh discovered this in the latter part of his reign. He had had too much influence on them.

Manasseh had angered the Lord. The Lord said, *"I am going to bring such disaster on Jerusalem and Judah that the ear of everyone who hears of it will tingle. I will wipe out Jerusalem as one wipes a dish, wiping it and turning it upside down." 2 Kings 21:12, 13* Not one good thing is remembered about Manasseh, only the evil he did during his lifetime.

How will we be remembered? Hopefully, for something virtuous. We want the influence we make on someone to be something worthwhile, not evil. We do not want to be a detriment to their destiny, as Manasseh was to the people of Judah.

Whether we want to or not, we do have an effect on those around us, family, friends and acquaintances. Our actions have a decisive role in influencing others.
