“LIGHT”

The word “light” is found 94 times in the NT. While it is occasionally used as a literal reference to the daytime or that which provides vision in the darkness, more often it is used in the moral or spiritual sense of purity or righteousness. Let’s notice a few very important teachings of the NT concerning light.

Surely it is fitting to begin with the foundational principle that God Himself is light (1 Jn. 1:5). On at least two occasions the light, or radiance of the Lord, was physically seen. Saul was temporarily blinded by the light of the Lord on the way to Damascus (Acts 9:3) and Christ was transfigured before the very eyes of Peter, James and John “and his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became white as light” (Mt. 17:2).

However, the light of the Lord is much deeper than His appearance. It is His essence. As “God is love” (1 Jn. 4:8), God also “is light” (1 Jn. 1:5). God “is holy” (1 Pt. 1:15). “[In] him is no darkness at all” (1 Jn. 1:5).

It is vital to understand that a God of light has called mankind “out of darkness into his marvelous light” (1 Pt. 2:9; see also Jn. 12:46) so they can become “sons of light” (Jn 12:36). As light and darkness do not mix, Christians are to have no part in the deeds of darkness (see 2 Cor. 6:14). Instead, they are to “put on the armor of light” (Rom. 13:12), “For salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed” (Rom. 13:11). One of the chief blessings of walking in the light is that of the continual cleansing provided through the blood of Jesus (see 1 Jn. 1:7).

Our prayer is that we will so walk in the light that others “may turn from darkness to light and from the power of Satan to God, that they may receive forgiveness of sins” (Acts 26:18) and give glory to God (see Mt. 5:16). But our light is not merely living a wholesome life before others, but sharing “the light of the Gospel” (2 Cor. 4:4).

As Christians walk in the light and seek to share the light of Jesus, many will reject the light, since it exposes their darkness (see Jn. 3:19-20). This should not be surprising since many rejected the true light in Jesus Himself (see John 1:9), yet our responsibility remains.

If God’s children will continue to live in and reflect His light, when life comes to an end, they will behold His glorious presence and have no need of sun nor lamp because “the Lord will be their lamp” (Rev. 22:5). Christian, be careful to walk in His light and you will be blessed!
