The Gospel for Christians

From the “Great Commission”, all Christians know the importance of preaching the gospel to every creature (**Mk. 16:15**). However, Paul was also “ready to preach the gospel to you (saints) who are in Rome” (**Rom. 1:15**). Because the gospel is God’s only power to save all who believe (**Rom. 1:16**), Christians should preach the gospel to others, but also to themselves every day. Paul tells us how to do that in **Romans 6**.

In this chapter Paul revealed two vital words that all of us need to understand. Without Romans, Christians would never understand the gospel as God’s power to keep the saved from Satan’s “sin, evil and nothing good” which dwells in the sinful nature of our “flesh” (**Rom. 7**).

Christians understand how the gospel saves the lost when they obey a form of the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus (**Rom. 6:3-4**). However, the blood of Jesus does more than wash away our past sins at baptism. We must continue to trust His blood to wash us of all future sins we may commit as Christians. However, Paul’s main emphasis in **Rom. 6** is “sanctification”, not “justification.” In this chapter Paul taught the saints to live sanctified lives with two key words.

Romans 6:6, “knowing this, that our old man was crucified with *Him . . .*”. The little song says: “Jesus Loves Me this I know for the Bible tells me so.” We may think of this as a “children’s song”. However, no adult can begin to fathom the depths of God’s love for us. While none of us will ever grasp the fullness of God’s love, by faith we accept it as an eternal truth “for the Bible tells (us) so.”

The second key word of the gospel for Christians is in **Rom. 6:11**: “Likewise you also, reckon (count) yourselves to be dead indeed to sin, but alive to God in Christ Jesus our Lord.” Paul lived his entire life by faith in the gospel as he declared: “I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live but Christ lives in me . . .” (**Gal. 2:20**). As far as Paul was concerned, the death of his old man of sin was a truth of God’s grace that he counted a fact as he took up his cross daily to follow Jesus (**Lk. 9:23**). As we remain focused on our death with Him and our new life in Him, He is free to live His new life in us. That is the gospel for Christians!
