This past week I began to reflect on a question I had never thought of before: can God "humble Himself". The answer is no. While it is true that we are to practice humility it is impossible for our perfect God to humble Himself. This is true because there is nothing and no one before whom He can humble Himself. Humility teaches us to humble ourselves before the Almighty, Perfect One of all eternity. However, while we all long to be more godly in attitude, we cannot imitate Him in humility!

Of course, there was a time in history when God the Son did "humble Himself" by leaving heaven to come into this sinful world to provide a way for us to escape Satan's kingdom of sin and cruel bondage. The inspired words of Paul say: *Philippians 2:5-11: ⁵ Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus, ⁶ who, being in the form of God, did not consider it robbery to be equal with God, ⁷ but made Himself of no reputation, taking the form of a bondservant, and coming in the likeness of men. ⁸ And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself and became obedient to the point of death, even the death of the cross. ⁹ Therefore God also has highly exalted Him and given Him the name which is above every name, ¹⁰ that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those in heaven, and of those on earth, and of those under the earth, ¹¹ and that every tongue*

should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

God the Father was so pleased with His Son that He highly exalted Him to His own Throne of glory and gave Him the name which is above every name in heaven, on earth and under the earth. Today those who will humble themselves in the sight of our Lord Jesus are promised that one day they will also be exalted to live with Him and His holy Father in heaven! First comes humility; then comes His eternal glory!

On the other hand, those who refuse to humble themselves will never taste God's heavenly glory in heaven, but will suffer the same condemnation of Satan himself who in his original sin refused to remain humble in the sight of our glorious God in heaven!
