"Spirit-Inspired"

But you must remain faithful to the things you have been taught. You know they are true, for you know you can trust those who taught you. You have been taught the holy Scriptures from childhood, and they have given you the wisdom to receive the salvation that comes by trusting in Christ Jesus. All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives. It corrects us when we are wrong and teaches us to do what is right. God uses it to prepare and equip his people to do every good work.

[2 Timothy 3:14-17 NLT](#)

I love Paul's challenge to Timothy to be faithful to what he had been taught and to remember why he could trust what he had been taught. Paul reminded Timothy that Scripture can make us wise, give us faith, correct us, teach us, prepare us, and equip us in two important ways: (1) through a Spirit-filled mentor or parent, and (2) through the Scriptures themselves, which he describes as holy and inspired (God-breathed or Spirit-inspired). The Scriptures' power lies in the words the Spirit inspired and the people who show the transforming influence of the Spirit at work in their lives. Why wouldn't we be eager to let the "sword of the Spirit" (God's word, [Ephesians 6:17](#)) be at work in our lives?

"I've suffered a great many catastrophes in my life. Most of them never happened."

If you are a worrier doesn't this sound familiar? If you worry a lot, you probably have a great imagination. Haven't you imagined every scenario that could possibly happen? How many times did it come to pass? And did your worrying affect the outcome at all?

We are all familiar with, "no news is good news." But for a worrier, it goes more like this, "no news is bad news." A worrier can take "no news" and build a mountain out of an ant hill. It is so easy. Just let your imagination run loose.

Have you ever wondered why there is very little about "worry/worrying" in the Scriptures? Could that be because it is very clear what we are to do about it? We are not to worry because God will take care of our needs and because our worrying cannot change a thing. Don't do it, because it is not necessary, and because it does no good! *"Casting all your care upon him; for he careth for you." (1 Peter 5:7)*

What example did Jesus use when he instructed us not to worry? It wasn't some elaborate example, was it? He used the birds of the air and the lilies of the field. We must use our faith. He told us not to worry about tomorrow because tomorrow would take care of itself.

So, if today, you have a real worry, turn it over to God. "If a care is too small to be turned into a prayer, it is too small to be made into a burden."
