God’s “GPS” of Salvation

Our technological society has become very familiar with the “GPS” which facilitates navigating from point A to point B. When properly set, the GPS prevents one from becoming “lost” when driving. I totally depend upon my GPS to navigate me through an unfamiliar city or location. I love it for the miles and the gasoline it saves me, not to mention all of the stress in wandering from street to street trying to find my way.

Our Creator fully recognized man’s desperate need for a spiritual GPS. His inspired prophet declared, **O LORD, I know the way of man is not in himself; It is not in man who walks to direct his own steps (Jer. 10:23).** No human being is born with a built-in spiritual GPS that will lead him to the Lord and His will. God has given Jesus and His word of truth as His GPS to navigate us from being “spiritually lost” to the eternal home of glory with the Father.

Many eternally jeopardize their souls by consulting the GPS of “human wisdom” and trusting their own “goodness” for salvation. The good moral person reasons that since he is living as morally good as some Christians, a God of love (if indeed He does exist) would never send him to hell! Even some Christians trust their own “good works” as the basis of their salvation. This “mind-set” leads many to conclude that when a “good” person dies he/she automatically goes to heaven. Such thinking reflects the error of human wisdom and a very faulty spiritual GPS.

Paul's epistle to the Romans clearly condemns trusting any human goodness, morality or even good Christian works as the basis of our hope for salvation. Such a spiritually faulty GPS is not programmed with God's wisdom. The only GPS that can be trusted is **God's Perfect Son**. Jesus declared (**Jn. 10:27**), **My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me**. Only those who follow the voice of Jesus as **the Way, the Truth and the Life (Jn. 14:6)** will be safely led to a home with the Father and His Son in heaven.

An understanding of Romans frees us from focusing upon the imperfection of our own righteousness so we can to refocus our hearts upon Jesus, God's only righteousness (**Rom. 3:21-22**). The good news of the gospel is that God has made His perfect righteousness available to all who will trust Jesus alone as the only basis of their hope for salvation.
