The Value of Bible School

We don’t live in the “land of Oz”, but if I had three wishes, one of them would be that all of our children would regularly attend Bible School. Why? Because the value of Bible study in the life of a child is difficult to overstate. Let me give you just a few reasons why I believe this to be so...

The Bible School provides resources that the average person may not have for training their children. It has materials and teachers that are suited for instructing children. While we have an important responsibility of teaching and training our own children, the Bible School utilizes individuals who are particularly proficient at teaching the Bible. Not all of us have great talent in that area. What a blessing it is for our children to benefit from the talents and dedication of others!

Young children “soak up” knowledge like a sponge. They actually learn at a much more rapid pace than adults. Missing out on Bible study as a younger child is kind of like not saving for retirement until one is fifty years old; it is incredibly difficult or impossible to make up for that lost time. Children learn much more than we think they do. Take for instance a child who is eight years old and has attended Bible School regularly since he was an infant. How much Bible is that child familiar with? The answer is: a whole bunch! He may know all the books of the Bible, be familiar with a majority of the Bible characters, and even be able to quote a handful of Scriptures!

However, Bible study is more than the gaining of knowledge. It is also training for a godly life. Children have enough negative influences in society. The Bible School helps combat that. Parents are instructed to "bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord" ([Ephesians 6:4](#)). Can you think of anything better for them, than making sure that they are regularly learning the teachings and values of Holy Scripture?

The value of Bible study is seen in that it also lays a strong foundation for deeper study as an adult. As adults, they will need to go on to learning deeper matters. If they never learned the basics, this will be very difficult for them. The Hebrew writer talks about folks who did not know the basics and should have been teachers themselves (see [Hebrews 5:12-14](#)). It is the children who attend Bible School that will be the teachers of tomorrow.

Two hours a week of public Bible study is so very little to invest in our children. The returns on that investment may be eternal. That is pretty good interest!
