A Righteousness From God

(Romans 1:16, 17)

The central thesis of Romans is found in 1:16, 17, and within it is the fundamental idea of God's righteousness. Righteousness is not only a characteristic of God, but it is also what He does. It is active – and not some static quality, like a halo around the heads of Jesus, angels, and holy people as sometimes depicted in medieval art. Additionally, God is faithful to His purposes and to His people despite their unfaithfulness. It is because of God's covenant faithfulness and His active righteousness in setting things right in our lives that we have hope.

The modern world has a lack of hope, and the resulting depression is self-treated by drugs, sex, and perverse immorality. Hopelessness breeds hopelessness. Man without God is an empty shell and, because of putting God out of his thoughts, is plunged into every kind of debauchery. When we read of atrocities, shootings in schools, drunken rages, and crimes by those in public office, this is the result of darkened minds and should not be a surprise to anyone. This is man without God, and the end is tragedy.

Paul's solution for sin was for man to find God, not only in nature, but also in the pages of the Scriptures, and to find redemption through Jesus. We have the key to turn around the lives of many people, and it is found in 1:16, 17. It is the duty of each local congregation to proclaim this hopeful message to the world. It is also the responsibility of each Christian to be part of the solution and not part of the problem. Which will you be?
