"All Glory to God!"

God has given each of you a gift from his great variety of spiritual gifts. Use them well to serve one another. Do you have the gift of speaking? Then speak as though God himself were speaking through you. Do you have the gift of helping others? Do it with all the strength and energy that God supplies. Then everything you do will bring glory to God through Jesus Christ. All glory and power to him forever and ever! Amen.

1 Peter 4:10-11 NLT

Why does God get the glory when we do what Peter commands in this passage? Because we do those things by God's powerful presence, the Holy Spirit living in us. We speak and we serve by the inspiration and power of the Spirit. The gifts that we are given come from the Holy Spirit — that's what the term "spiritual gifts" means. Jesus poured out the Holy Spirit on us when we came to him (Titus 3:3-7), and the Spirit gives each of us gifts to use in the body of Christ (1 Corinthians 12:4-7) and to help others (<u>Luke 10:25-37</u>; <u>Galatians 6:10</u>). The glory belongs to God — Father, Son, and Spirit because God is the source and the strength of all of the good that we do.

"Too Little"

When Micah said, "But as for you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, too little to be among the clans of Judah, from the One will go forth for Me to be ruler in Israel" (Micah 5:2), he was predicting the birth of the Messiah, Jesus Christ, in Bethlehem about seven hundred years later (Mt. 2:1, 6). He was also suggesting a great truth: that things, and people, who seem to be "too little," too insignificant, too sick, too young, or too old, may still accomplish great things.

All kinds of success stories illustrate that people who were thought to be "too little" — to be inferior in some way — accomplished great things. Helen Keller, though deaf and blind, became a great woman. A friend of mine who wanted to be a preacher was told by his teacher in a college speech class that he would never be able to preach, but he became one of the most well-known preachers of his day.

When we think we are inferior and cannot accomplish anything worthwhile, we should remember Bethlehem. This town was "too little," but it became the birthplace of the Christ. He was born in a stable to a poor family in an insignificant place (not in a palace), yet none other could have accomplished what He did! No one is ever "too little" to accomplish all that God wants him to do (Phil. 4:13).
